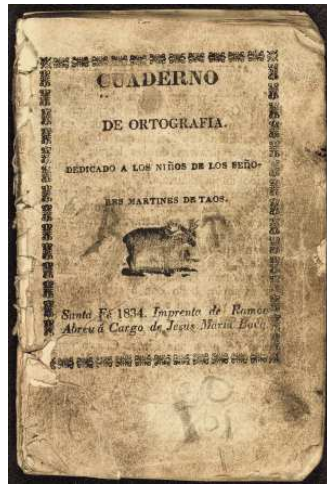


Spanish-Language Resources on the Web
